#1 The meeting was called to order. The minutes from the April 18, 2019 meeting were approved.

#2 Hope Clinic of McKinney

Candy Blair introduced Caitlin Twyman Hope Clinic of McKinney. Ms. Twyman gave a presentation on her clinic's highlights and how Hope Clinic serves the uninsured population. Hope Clinic currently serves uninsured, indigent residents of McKinney. Hope Clinic offers a variety of medical, vision and dental services in addition to primary care services. The clinic serves as a safety net clinic for trauma patients that have fallen in the Medicaid gap. They opened its doors in July 2017 and have partnered with several corporations, including Samaritan Inn. Hope Clinic created a program for Samaritan Inn residents who are in need of ADD evaluations, treatment and patient monitoring to be able to work and maintain employment. The clinic's vision is to be able to provide a true medical home to their patients.

#3 Health Care Services General Update

Candy Blair gave a general update on health outbreaks in our county. The county Immunization Clinic is extensively busy with back-to-school immunization. The clinic is fully stocked in anticipation of a very busy back-to-school season, there are currently no shortages on these vaccines. A nationwide shortage on Tubersol (TB skin testing) has been reported which affects our state and county jails. The county is closely monitoring this situation.
