Collin County Historic Property Tax Abatement Process

Collin County has a Historic Property Tax Abatement program. Residential properties that qualify can get 100% Historic Property Tax abatement and Commercial properties can get 50% Historic Property Tax Abatement. The Collin County Historical Commission manages the program for the County Commissioners.

To qualify for the Historic Property Tax Abatement, a structure must be at least 50 years old and in good condition. The structure should appear as it was originally built with no added or removed rooms, for example.

Go to https://www.collincountytx.gov/historical_commission/programs/Pages/taxabatements.aspx to Download a tax abatement packet, which will include instructions and an application form. The applicant must submit a fully-documented and footnoted history of the property with photos of the structure, both historic and current if possible.

Send the application to CCHCmail@yahoo.com with the subject of **Tax Abatement**. Once an application has been approved by the Tax Abatement Committee, the property will be added to the list of properties to be inspected annually and the applicant will be notified of the approval.

Properties that have been approved for Historic Property Tax Abatement will be inspected in November to see if they are being well maintained. There is no warning period to make repairs. Currently there are about 250 properties in the county receiving Historic Property Tax Abatement.

Deadline to submit is October 31, 2022.

CC Coalition Member Collin County Genealogical Society

The Collin County Genealogical Society (CCGS) was formed in October 1970 by six local residents for the purpose of promoting interest in genealogy and assisting members with their genealogical research. The group originally was named the Plano Genealogical and Historical Society and later the North Central Texas Genealogical and Historical Society. The current name Collin County Genealogical Society was bestowed in November 1979 to better recognize the growing needs of the community. The Society established a permanent residence at the Gladys L. Harrington Library in Plano in January 1971.

CCGS has many ongoing projects and Society publications to benefit the amateur to the professional genealogist and historian. The Society welcomes all. Collin County ancestors are not necessary. Through fundraising activities CCGS continuously purchases reference books for the genealogical collection housed at the W. O. Haggard Library in the Genealogy Center.

We are a non-profit organization that continues to identify, preserve and digitize historical Collin County newspapers, which can be found on the Portal to Texas Digital Newspaper Project.
