CC Coalition Cemetery Association Member Stoney Point Cemetery

Stoney Point Baptist Church and Cemetery are located about six miles east of Melissa, Collin County, Texas on Farm Road 545. The church building is about two hundred feet south of the road; the cemetery is east of the building with the entrance on the west side of the cemetery. In the 1870's and 1880's, Stoney Point was a thriving community with a cotton gin, a general store operated, a molasses mill, a grist mill, church, and school.

The Baptist Church of Christ at Stoney Point was organized on August 17, 1878; however, the first land on which to build a church was not deeded until 1883 by Andrew Jackson (A. J.) Scribner and R. N. Coffey. The next deed that granted land was January 3, 1885 by John Calvin Price and wife Elizabeth Ann (Roper) Price. There is no one living, at this time, who knows where these earliest meetings were held. In all probability, they were held in the homes or in the Johnson School house, until a building could be erected.
