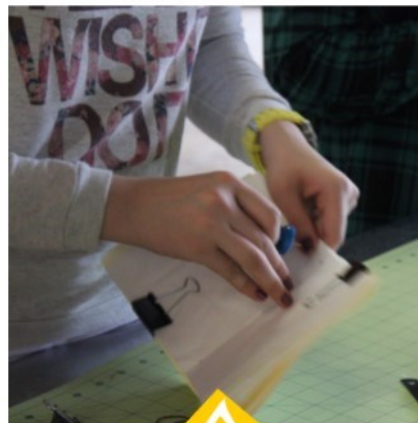

"We used to know that..." is an interesting phrase I began hearing several months ago. Many of the classes and workshops taught today, were once commonplace skills more than 60 years ago.

Saturday Seminars

The staff & volunteers of the Collin County Farm Museum invite you to join us on Saturday's as we dust off historic artifacts & practical design elements of rural living in order to explore different elements of rural design. Furthermore, the last 30 min. of each seminar will be focused on the design of a tiny house for the 2018 Collin County Rural Heritage Fair.

PASSIVE ENERGY: Using examples of artifacts and records from the Collin County Farm Museum's collection, such as the Kitchen Wagon & the Cumberland House model, the seminar will discuss different elements and designs for passive energy.

GRAVITY PLUMBING: Using examples of water well artifacts and records from the Collin County Farm Museum's collection, the seminar will demonstrate gravity based plumbing.

NO OUTLETS: Very few artifacts in the Collin County Farm Museum run on electricity because, historically, electricity was hard to supply in rural areas. This seminar explores a variety of kitchen and home tools from the museum's collection that use resources other than electricity.

TALES FROM THE outhouse: Using the Cumberland House model at the Collin County Farm Museum, the seminar will explore tales of historic outhouses as well as the science of composting human waste.

THAT'S ILLUMINATING: Besides the lightbulb and candle flames, what other forms of illumination were historically used? Using artifacts in the Collin County Farm Museum, seminar will shed some light on the subject.

THE WEIGHT OF THINGS: Today we describe things by their dimensional size, when things used to be described by their weight. Why was weight more important to know? Several artifacts in the Collin County Farm Museum's collection answers this question.

STORE TODAY, USE TOMORROW: Using various artifacts in the Collin County Farm Museum's collection, learn how things, like food and clothing and tools were stored and used.
