Collin County is hosting a Virtual Open House and Opportunity to Comment for the Collin County Outer Loop – Southeast Project, a new location planned transportation facility extending approximately 14 miles from CR 656 in Farmersville, TX to the Rockwall/Collin County line. The Virtual Open House materials may be accessed on the project website (www.ccol-se.com) from Monday, September 15, 2025, through Tuesday, September 30, 2025. This is not a live or in-person event. The public is invited to provide comments through September 30, 2025. Information on how to submit comments is below.

This Virtual Open House is being held to notify the public that Collin County has identified a preferred alignment in the northern and southern portions of the study area and to seek public input on a revised alignment option in the middle part of the study area near Nevada and Josephine, TX. The new alignment option in this area was developed by the study team in consideration of public and stakeholder comments received during the Spring 2025 public meeting, while still meeting the project's overall purpose to address future mobility and connectivity needs in Collin County.

An in-person public meeting will be held later this fall to provide additional project updates and notify the public of a preferred alignment in the middle part of the study area near Josephine and Nevada, TX.

About the Study

The Collin County Outer Loop is a 55-mile planned transportation facility that will ultimately span from the Denton/Collin County line, through cities including Celina, Weston, Anna, Melissa, Farmersville, Josephine and Royse City, to the Rockwall/Collin County line. This project consists of Segments 2 and 4, which extend approximately 14 miles, from County Road 656 in Farmersville to the Rockwall County line. A previous study evaluated the feasibility of multiple alignments and identified the previous Technically Preferred Alignment (PTPA) in 2009 and 2010. The Collin County Outer Loop – Southeast project will identify an updated preferred alignment, develop the schematic design for the roadway and evaluate potential project impacts through the development of a Local Environmental Document.

The project aims to address population growth in the southeastern portion of the county by enhancing north-south connectivity, managing congestion, and enhancing safety. Impacts to existing, planned and future development, floodplains, property, and other environmental factors will be minimized where possible.
