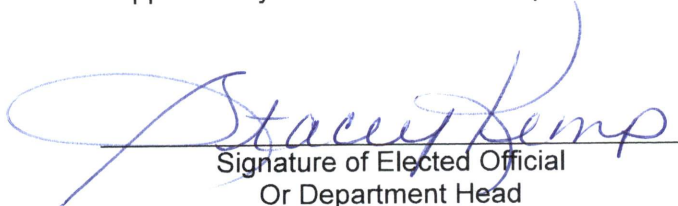

In March/April 2020, as the Covid-19 pandemic began, the Probate and Mental offices were asked to reduce in office staff by 50 percent. Lana volunteered to stay in the office. The attorney's we work with were required to send documents in prior to hearings which was a completely different process. Lana scheduled appointments for the public to visit the office to ensure the business that had to be done within this court was not delayed. Lana was able to adapt to all the constant changing policies with grace. Lana would also give suggestions when she thought a policy change could be better. Lana made sure that when the offices re-opened that the 6 feet rule was adhered to by even making marks on the floor. Lana took on a leadership role.
