Why the Honoree is receiving a GEM Award including dates:

In January 2015, CSCDs across the state of Texas will transition over from using the current risk need assessment tool (Wisconsin) to the newly developed TRAS assessment instrument. CSCD officers across the state of Texas will be required to be trained and certified on the new TRAS instrument. Mr. Wiseman recently volunteered and completed all of the necessary training to be a certified TRAS Trainer. It should be noted that Mr. Wiseman not only qualified to be a trainer, but he was also given the status of being a Lead Trainer who does not require any additional supervision from another instructor. Mr. Wiseman, along with co-trainers, Brittany Gurney and Jill Pharr, have already completed two of their scheduled four training sessions for the month of September (each training session last two days). These trainings will help to ensure that all Collin County CSCD Supervision Officers will be trained and certified by the January 2015 transition date. Mr. Wiseman and his co-trainers will then be conducting four additional trainings to help train several CSCD's from the surrounding counties on the TRAS instrument.
