Why the Honoree is receiving a GEM Award including dates:

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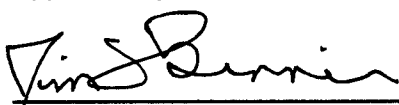
I would like to nominate CJIS Clerk Chris Humble for a GEM award.

In September 2017, Chris put many hours of testing into the viability of the new SoftCode software. The impending implementation of this software meant that we would lose our access to the LE node in ODY. She worked tirelessly to troubleshoot and test reporting features to ensure that we wouldn't lose any of our current functionality, in both the civil area and in warrants, once converted. At that time, the timeline indicated to me by IT for any anticipated testing/demo for the software was at about a year. But, after all of Chris' hard work that timeline had decreased by about 6 months. Her expertise and insistence also pushed the vendor to go back and work to produce some of the integrations necessary so that we lose none of our current ability to ensure our officer's safety through shared party data.

In addition, in November 2017, Chris assisted me in working with IT in an effort to clean up old warrants and conversion warrants. She verified some very old warrants through the courts and reactivated them on RGN. We ran them through TLO to find new, updated addresses and mailed letters on them, resulting in several of them being recalled. We also met with staff from the District Clerk's office over a list of approximately 1,000 warrants that had been sitting in improper (although active) status for years, preventing them from showing up on any statistical reports and worked to get those cleaned up. This, combined with the work we did on the old warrants, resulted in approximately 1,500 warrants being cleaned up by either correction or clearing them altogether.

Chris continually performs at a high level and provides assistance when needed. She is an invaluable asset to the Sheriff's Office and we're fortunate to have her on our team.

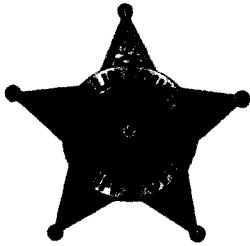
