
Why the Honoree is receiving a GEM Award including dates:

On January 8th, 2024, a suspect was scheduled to appear in the 380th District Court of Collin County for a trial. The suspect had been released from the Collin County Detention Facility after being arrested on two counts of Sexual Assault of a Child and one count of Indecency w/child Sexual Contact and was being monitored by a GPS device that was court-ordered as a condition of his release.

The suspect, who failed to show up for his trial earlier in the day, cut off his GPS device with his last known location to be in the Dallas Love Field Airport area. The 380th District Court reissued the three felony warrants for the suspect.

On January 9th, 2024, Collin County GHOST Investigator Gean Blaylock, who is also assigned as a task force officer with the U.S. Marshal Joint East Texas Task Force (JETFTF), was assigned this case. Investigator Blaylock immediately began locating the suspect, who was believed to have fled the area and possibly had been assisted by family and a girlfriend. Between January 9th, 2024, and March 13th, 2024, Investigator Blaylock, with the assistance of several other GHOST investigators, spent countless manpower hours on this investigation attempting to locate the suspect. Investigator Blaylock led all efforts, including preparing, applying, and approving over 15 search warrants. The continued pursuit by Investigator Blaylock to locate the suspect culminated on March 13th, 2024, when Investigator Blaylock obtained a location in Denton County where the suspect was hiding out in an apartment with the assistance of a girlfriend.

Investigator Blaylock, assisted by other members of the JETFTF, was able to take the suspect into custody in Carrollton, TX, after the suspect attempted one more time to elude law enforcement by unsuccessfully escaping out the rear balcony of the apartment. The suspect was transported to the Collin County Detention Facility and booked on three felony warrants, where he will remain awaiting his trial.

Deputy Blaylock's continued efforts, working countless hours and going above and beyond the call of duty to bring this fugitive into custody, should be recognized.
