
Why the Honoree is receiving a GEM Award including dates:

During October of 2023, Detention Officer Yearwood provided extensive assistance to dozens of external law enforcement agencies, to the Detention Intelligence Unit (DIU), and the North Texas Fusion Center (NTFC). As part of her DIU duties Officer Yearwood worked 90 Inmate Request Manager tasks, worked 29 gang-related RFIs, validated 22 criminal gang members, and conducted 17 inmate interviews. In support of the NTFC, Yearwood processed 17 Homeland Security Information Network (HSIN) RFIs and 10 Terrorist Screening Center (TSC) RFIs, and completed a SAR entry for outside law enforcement. On top of these duties, Yearwood taught two Gang Tattoo and Code Recognition classes and two Introduction to Mexican Cartel classes to Detention Officers, CCSO Patrol Deputies, and external law enforcement.

Officer Yearwood also provided a high level of investigative collaboration and support to external law enforcement agencies during October of 2023.
