MEMORANDUM

To: Major Palmisano

On 01-21-13, the Sheriff received an e-mail from Judge Barnett Walker, in reference to a [REDACTED]. The Judge advised that he was going to issue a warrant for the suspect and he wanted us to know that the guy might be violent. The Judge described the suspect as "Likely delusional and is to be considered a potential security and safety threat". The information was passed on to you and you supplied several Facebook photos of the suspect that appeared to be very concerning.

On, 01-22-13, Deputies David Richardson and Roger Kisloski went to the suspect's residence to serve the warrant. The deputies were unable to locate the suspect, but did leave business cards with the neighbors in case they saw the suspect.

On, 01-23-13, a neighbor called in and advised the suspect was outside his residence talking to the mailman. By the time the Patrol Deputy arrived the suspect was back inside his residence and refused to come out. Since the warrant was a misdemeanor the Patrol Deputy cleared the location.

On, 01-24-13, Deputies Richardson and Kisloski, went back to the suspects residence and located him inside. The suspect refused to come out and he also refused entry to the Deputies. The Deputies requested a search warrant be issued to search the home for the suspect. Sgt. Mike Vance prepared a search warrant and the warrant was presented to Judge Walker for his approval. Judge Walker signed the warrant at 9:40am, photocopy of

the warrant was sent to the Deputies at 9:43am and suspect was arrested (after a forced entry) by Deputies at 9:47am.

The Deputies went the extra mile by staying after the suspect, even though it was a misdemeanor warrant. It was important, knowing the suspects past, that he be placed in custody. They went to the residence several times, they passed out business cards and when they finally made contact they obtained a search warrant to make the arrest.
