On 12-21-21 Telecommunicator Ryan Heflin was on duty when he got his first structure fire of the day. This fire required 2 fire departments and EMS. Ryan kept up with all comments from the units, without any difficulty, all units cleared after an hour and 10 minutes.

An hour and a half later, Ryan got another structure fire that required 5 fire departments, EMS, and Fire Marshals. Ryan was able to keep up with all 90 pages of radio traffic without any difficulty for the next 2 and a half hours, as well as keep a timer going for status checks (par) on the fire personnel battling the fire.

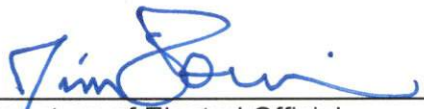
During this same time, a vehicle fire was received at our center. An RV was on fire only 40 feet from a residence. There was also a 2 vehicle accident. He was able to dispatch both while listening to the separate fire ground channels that the structure fire, vehicle fire, and accident without missing any radio traffic.

Ryan never had anything negative to say and kept an upbeat attitude during the whole shift, as he does with every shift he works.

Ryan always helps without asking and is always volunteering for shift coverage. Ryan is an excellent team player.
